

## MILESTONE AWARDS

The Pikes Peak Model A Ford Club Milestone Awards program is a FREE program for all active members. As this award is based on the honor system, it will be up to each participant to be honest and report true mileage to the chairperson on an annual basis. Awards are presented for Model A automobiles with A, B, or C engines only. Special awards can be presented to other participants for miles driven at the discretion of the Milestone Chairperson.

- Recorded miles are intended to represent the total mileage accumulated for each vehicle, regardless of who owns or drives it. Mileage Awards will be based off of the total recorded mileage accumulated on all Model "A"s owned by the participant over the course of the fiscal year.
- The Milestone program runs from 1 November through 31 October each year.
- It is the participant's responsibility to notify the Milestone Chairperson with ending mileage no later than 31 October each year.
- The Milestone Chairperson will:
  - Record the beginning mileage and start date for each participant
  - Record the ending mileage for each participant each year, when notified by the participant
  - Determine if each participant is eligible for an award
  - Determine whether any special awards will be presented for the current year
- Awards will consist of two items:
  - A plaque that recognizes the achievement
    - In order to save some costs, when a member receives a subsequent plaque, return of the previous plaque is appreciated, but not mandatory.
    - Mileage plaques will be awarded for the following milestones:
      - 1,000 miles
      - 2,500 miles
      - 5,000 miles
      - 7,500 miles
      - 10,000 miles
    - Continue for every 2,500-mile increment thereafter.
  - A mileage bar to be hung under a Quail Club name tag
    - Mileage bars will be awarded starting at 1000 miles, and for every 500-mile increment thereafter.
    - If a member is not yet a member of the Quail Club, a generic name tag will be presented to hang the bar from.
- Awards will be distributed to each qualifying participant at the Christmas Party each year. If the participant is unable to attend, the award may be given to the participant at a general meeting in the future.

## **QUAIL CLUB**

The Pikes Peak Model A Ford Club's Quail Club recognizes those members who participate on a regular and recurring basis – the foundation of participation in club activities which allows everyone to enjoy the vehicles, the company and share that excitement with the public. It is based on a point system, with points awarded for participation in activities and events and driving the Model A in the community. There are three categories of events: Driving Events, Non-Driving Events, and Higher-than-club Level Events.

The Club Membership Chair will keep a list of attendance at all club activities and events and will determine what qualifies as a Driving Event vs. a Non-Driving Event.

Driving Events are defined as those activities that 'require' bringing a Model A. It includes events for which members meet at a designated point and convoy to a destination, such as tours or parades. It also includes static car displays, such as at a nursing home, where we bring the vehicles for the enjoyment of the residents. Members will receive 2 points for each Driving Event they participate in. If a club member does not own a Model A, riding in another member's A will count as participation in a Driving Event.

Non-Driving Events are all other club activities, such as general membership meetings, club breakfasts and lunches, etc. Members will receive 1 point for each Non-Driving Event they participate in. If a member drives their Model A to the meeting/breakfast/lunch, they will be awarded an extra point.

Higher-than-club Level Events include Regional and National Conventions and Tours. Members will receive 5 points for registering and participating in each event. If a member drives their Model A to the event, they will receive an additional number of points equal to 1 point for every 100 miles driven in the Model A. If our club hosts a regional or national event, members will receive 5 points for participation in planning and hosting the event.

To qualify for the Quail Club, a member must accumulate at least 30 points in any one fiscal year. This must include a minimum of 20 points from Driving Events (at least 10 Driving Events) and a minimum of 10 points from Non-Driving Events (at least 10 Non-Driving Events). Participation in a Higher-than-club Level Event will drop the requirement to 8 Driving and 8 Non-Driving Events, while the 30 point total remains. For those members who qualify in any given year, a Quail Club name tag will be presented at the Christmas Party. Once a Quail Club member, always a Quail Club member!

## **ROADRUNNER AWARD**

One award will be presented each year to the member who accumulated the most points for the entire fiscal year, representing the highest attendance in the most events and sharing their Model A with the public. This award will be in the same form as the mileage bar, but will read "Roadrunner Award – YYYY" with the year awarded.
